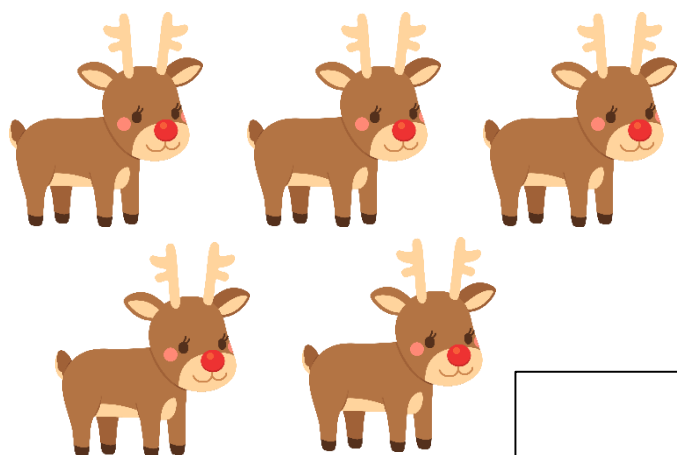

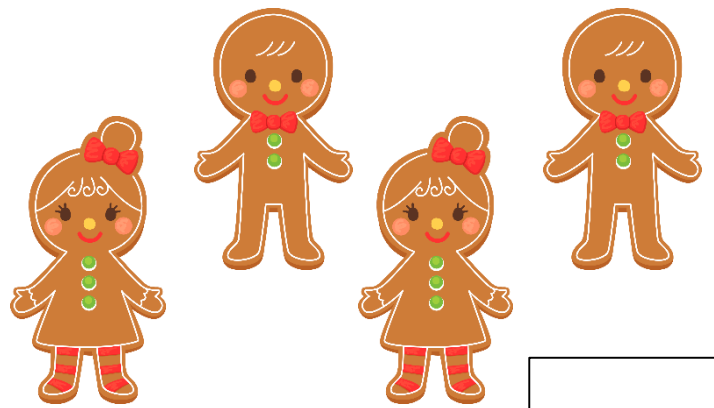

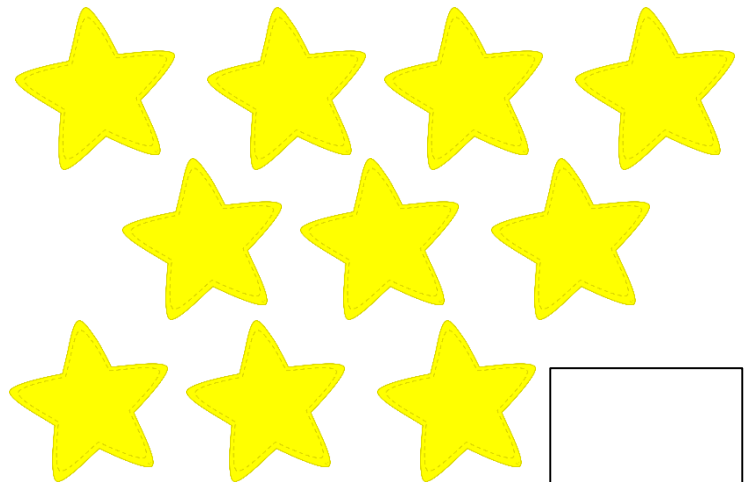

## Directions:

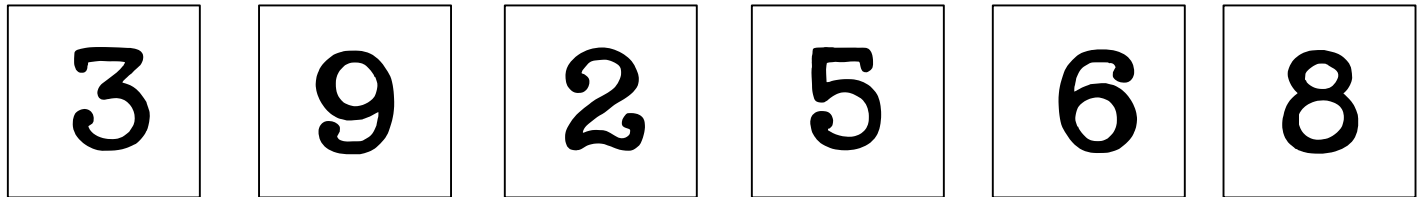
### Option 1

- Store the numbers on the bottom of each counting page.

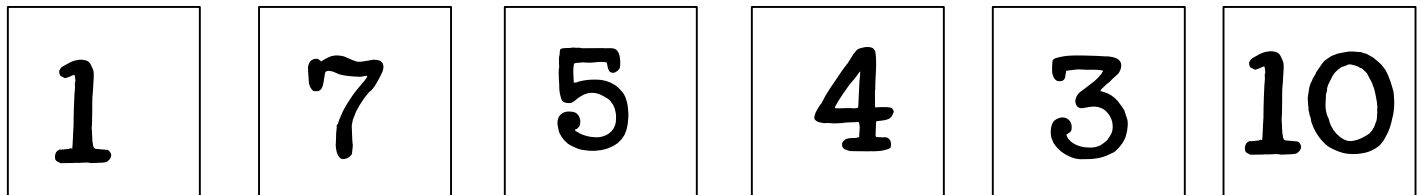
### Option 2

- Create a File Folder activity. Place one sheet on each side of the file folder.
- Laminate the file folder and place hard Velcro on all the empty squares on both pages
- Put soft Velcro on the back of each laminated number piece and cut them out.

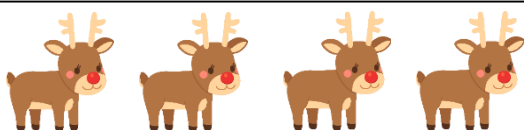
